A series of wars between the Cavaliers and the Roundheads to decide how England should be governed.

Parliament of the United Kingdom1st January
1801

The creation of the parliament we know today after joining the Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland.

HRH Queen Elizabeth II6th February
1952

The current monarch, Queen Elizabeth II's coronation.
