Ordination	The action of ordaining someone in holy orders, elevated to the clergy.

Who has been/or could be called to God?

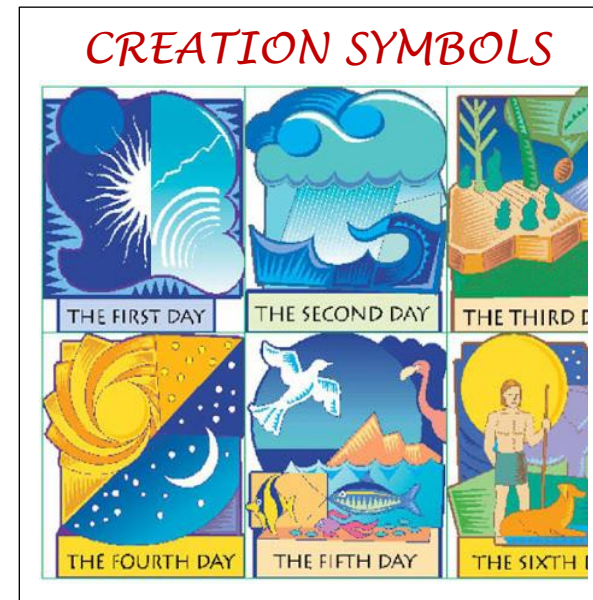

Jesus	The Son of God.
Mother Theresa	A Roman Catholic nun and missionary. She founded charities to help the poor and sick people.
Bible Society	A non-profit organization devoted to translating, publishing and distributing Bibles at affordable prices.
Christian Aid	An official relief and development agency of 41 churches in the UK and Ireland which works to support and develop countries in South America, the Caribbean, Africa and Asia.
Tearfund	A UK Christian relief and development agency offering support through Christian churches and other Christian organisations around the world.

### Year 3 - Exploring the sadness and joy of Easter- (Spring 2)

Vocabulary	Word definition
Palm Sunday	The Sunday before Easter on which Christ entered into Jerusalem, many churches celebrate with processions carrying palms.
Temple	A building devoted to the worship of a god or gods.
2.Last Supper	The meal eaten by Christ with his disciples on the night before his crucifixion.
Gethsemane	A garden outside of Jerusalem where Jesus was arrested.
Good Friday	The Friday before Easter Sunday, on which the Crucifixion of Christ is remembered in the Christian Church.
Crucified	Someone who is put to death by nailing or binding them to a cross.
Easter Sunday	The day when we remember Jesus' resurrection from death.
Resurrection	The rising of Christ from the dead.

#### Key Questions-To think about

1. Is it possible to describe the events of Holy Week and Easter simply as events of joy or sadness? Why? Why not?
2. Is the cross a symbol of joy or sadness?
3. Is Good Friday the beginning or the end?
4. Is Easter Sunday the end or the beginning?

Rules	A set of regulations.
Laws	The system of rules a country follows which regulate what is happens.
Moses	He was the most important prophet in Judaism.
Commandment	One of 10 divine rules.
Mount Sinai	A mountain in Egypt that is mentioned in the Bible and the Quran.
Arc of the Covenant	A gold covered wooden chest that contains the stone tablets of the Ten Commandments.
Old Testament	The first part of the Christian Bible containing thirty -nine books.
New Testament	The second part of the Christian Bible that contains the Gospels-Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

Vocabulary	Word definition
Sacred Texts	Texts that are related to a religious belief.
The Holy Bible	A collection of sacred texts or scriptures. The Christians Holy Book.
The Torah Scroll	A handwritten copy of the Torah containing the five books of Moses. It is mainly used during Jewish prayer.
Quran	The central religious text of Islam, which Muslims believe to be a revelation from God (Allah).
Christian	A person who has received Christian baptism or is a believer in Christianity.
Muslims	People who follow or practice Islam, Muslims consider the Quran their holy book, the word of God as revealed by the Islamic messenger Mohammed.
Judaism	The religion of the Jews.

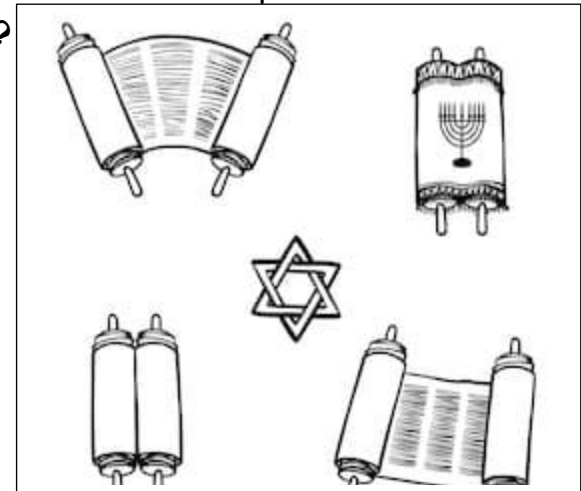
