Vocabulary	Word definition
Town	A place with many streets and buildings, where people live and work. A town is usually larger than a village but smaller than a city
Countryside	Land not in towns, cities, or industrial areas, that is either used for farming or left in its own natural state
Country	An area of land with boundaries which fits within a continent.
Capital City	A city where the regions government is located. It is a city where government buildings are and government leaders work.
Continent	Large land masses which except for Antarctica are made up of a group of countries. The seven continents are Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Europe, North America, Oceanica and South America
United Kingdom	A group of islands off the northwest coast of Europe. It is a unique country made up of four nations: England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland. England, Wales, and Scotland also make up Great Britain .
Landmarks	A human or physical feature which is well known in an area and can represent that place.
Sea	a body of salt water not as large as an ocean and often nearly surrounded by land

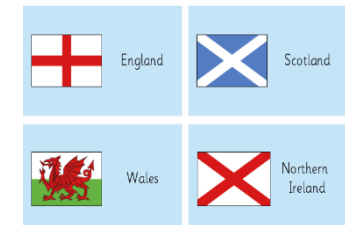
