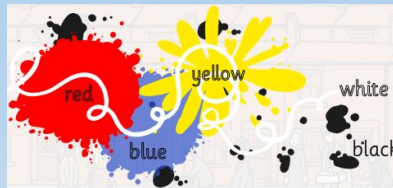
LS Lowry

- He is well known for painting industrial scenes and matchstick characters.
- He drew many pictures in pencil, charcoal and pen.
- He liked to draw things he could see around Pendlebury.

Art techniques

- Landscape means everything you can see when you look across an area of land.
- Perspective means drawing 3D objects to give the right impression of its height, width, depth and position in relation to each other.

- I can mix paint from 'Lowry colours'.
- I can paint a seascape.
- I can paint things that are small so they look far away.
- I can paint things in pale colours so they look far away.
- I can draw the outline of buildings of different sizes.
- I can fill in details like roofs, doors and windows.
- I can draw figures in a matchstick style.
- I can draw figures that show action.
- I can carefully cut out my drawings.
- I can use my scissors safely.
- I can stick my buildings onto my painted background.
- I can stick my matchstick figures at the front to make a city scene.



charcoal

A black substance obtained by burning wood without much air. It can be burned as a fuel, and small sticks of it are used for drawing with.

collage

A picture that has been made by sticking pieces of coloured paper and cloth onto paper.

drawing

A picture made with a pen or pencil.

gallery

A place that has permanent exhibitions of works of art in it.

industrial

You use industrial to describe things which relate to or are used in industry.

landscape

The landscape is everything you can see when you look across an area of land, including hills, rivers, buildings, trees, and plants.

matchstick figures

A picture of a person drawn only with thin lines for the arms and legs and a circle for the head.

painting

A picture which some has painted.

perspective

The art of making some objects or people in a picture look further away than others.

seascape

A painting or photograph of a scene at sea.

terraced house

A row of similar houses joined together by their side walls.
