

She wants to make the insects look beautiful. •All of the insects she uses in her work are real. She owns over 30,000 bugs. •Jennifer tries to use Victorian patterns to inspire her insect designs. •Angus hopes that her work will make people interested in insects so that more people will help to fight against the destruction of their habitats. <p><i>In the Midnight Garden</i></p>  	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •I can draw details showing that I have looked many times at the photograph. •I can draw a thorax, abdomen and head in my insect. •I can draw an insect in pencil. •I can show colours and choose colours appropriately for my drawing. •I can roll and scrunch paper. •I can fix modelled paper into place with tape to make an insect shape. •I can tear up pieces of coloured tissue paper. •I can choose appropriate tissue paper colours for my insect model. •I can cover my insect model with layers of glue and attach the tissue paper pieces.   	<p>abdomen Your abdomen is the part of your body below your chest where your stomach and intestines are.</p> <p>antennae A pair of mobile appendages on the heads of insects that respond to touch and taste.</p> <p>colour The colour of something is the appearance that it has as a result of the way in which it reflects light. Red, blue, and green are colours.</p> <p>form The form of something is its shape.</p> <p>head The head is the top part of your body, which has your eyes, mouth, and brain in it.</p> <p>line A line is a long thin mark which is drawn or painted on a surface.</p> <p>pattern A pattern is an arrangement of lines or shapes, especially a design in which the same shape is repeated at regular intervals over a surface.</p> <p>shape A shape is a space enclosed by an outline, for example a square or a triangle.</p> <p>texture The texture of something is the way that it feels when you touch it, for example how smooth or rough it is.</p> <p>thorax An insect's thorax is the central part of its body to which the legs and wings are attached.</p> <p>tone A tone is one of the lighter, darker, or brighter shades of the same colour.</p> <p>wings The wings of an insect are the two parts of its body that it uses for flying.</p>
