Michelangelo (1475-1564)

- Born in 1475 in Italy and died in 1564.
- He was a sculptor, painter, architect, poet and engineer.
- He is most famous for his sculptures 'David' and 'Pieta'.
- His more famous paintings are in the Sistine Chapel. They took him four years to complete, painting them upside down whilst on scaffolding.

Le Corbusier (1887-1967)

- Born in 1887 in Switzerland.
- He was an architect, designer of furniture and painter.
- He designed buildings because he thought it was important to build better places to live for people in crowded cities.

- architect** A man whose job it is to design buildings.
- ceiling** The horizontal surface that forms the top part or roof inside a room.
- concrete** A substance used for building which is made by mixing together cement, sand, small stones, and water.
- fresco** A picture that is painted on a plastered wall when the plaster is still wet.
- grind** To grind something is to crush an object between two hard surfaces or with a machine until it becomes a fine powder.
- plaster** A smooth paste made of sand, lime, and water which goes hard when it dries and is used to cover walls and ceilings.
- rectangular** Something that is shaped like a rectangle.
- Sistine Chapel** The chapel of the pope in the Vatican at Rome.
- terrace**
 1. A row of similar houses joined together by their side walls.
 2. A flat area of stone or grass next to a building where people can sit.
