David Hockney (1937- Present)

- Hockney is a painter, draughtsman, printmaker, stage designer and photographer.
- He sometimes paints from his memory, but other times he paints with the object right in front of him.
- Picasso, Matisse and Fragonard were his favourite artists when he was younger.
- He has a condition called synaesthesia which means that he sees colour when he hears music.

Man Ray (1890-1976)

- . He called himself a painter but was best known for photography.
- . His real name was Emmanuel Radnitzky, although he never used this name once he had become an artist. Emmanuel's nickname was 'Manny', which became 'Man' eventually.
- Man Ray's family were Russian Jewish. The family changed its name to 'Ray' because of racism towards Jews at the time in America.

- blemish** A small mark on something that spoils its appearance.
- blend** If you blend substances together, you mix them together so they become one substance.
- creases** Creases in someone's skin are lines which form where their skin folds when they move.
- form** The form of something is its shape.
- jagged** Something that is jagged has a rough, uneven shape or edge with lots of sharp points.
- mark-making** Mark-making is a term used to describe the different lines, patterns, and textures we create in a piece of art.
- scars** A mark on the skin which is left after a wound has healed.
- self-portrait** A drawing that you do of yourself.
- shape** A space enclosed by an outline, for example a circle, a square, or a triangle.
- smooth** A smooth surface has no roughness, lumps, or holes.
- smudge** If you smudge a substance, you make it less neat by touching or rubbing it.
- texture** The texture of something is the way that it feels when you touch it.
- tone** A tone is one of the lighter, darker, or brighter shades of the same colour.
- wrinkles** Lines which form on someone's face as they grow old.
