

| <p><b><u>Joaquin Torres Garcia (1874-1949)</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Torres Garcia was famous for using symbols such as horoscopes, traffic symbols and ancient cultures in his artworks.</li> <li>His biggest influences were the artist, Mondrian and ancient people such as the ancient Greeks and Egyptians.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Leonora Carrington (1917-2011)</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Leonora Carrington was an artist and a writer, although she was also involved in making murals, textiles, costumes, poems and masks.</li> <li>Carrington painted dream-like images, using fantasy characters.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Diego Rivera (1886-1957)</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He was famous for making murals.</li> <li>His parents caught him drawing on the wall at a very young age. Rather than telling him off, they hung chalkboards and canvases on the walls for him to draw on.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Beatriz Milhazes (1960 – Present)</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>She is a collage artist and painter who uses very colourful materials to create pictures.</li> <li>She is influenced by the tropical flowers and plants near her home in Brazil, and also the carnivals and culture of Brazil.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I can paint symbols.</li> <li>I can design and paint a pattern onto a paper plate circle.</li> <li>I can weave wool and add feathers to my dream catcher.</li> <li>I can draw a person in colour.</li> <li>I can select and arrange coloured squares.</li> <li>I can create a design for a collagraph.</li> <li>I can print my collagraph not my collage.</li> </ul>    | <p><b>Aztecs</b> A member of an indigenous Mexican people who established a great empire, centred on the valley of Mexico, that was overthrown by Cortés and his followers in the early 16th century.</p> <p><b>Brazil</b> A republic in South America.</p> <p><b>clashing</b> If one colour or style clashes with another, the colours or styles look ugly together.</p> <p><b>collagraphy</b> A printmaking process in which materials are applied to a rigid substrate.</p> <p><b>culture</b> It consists of activities such as the arts and philosophy, which are considered to be important for the development of civilization and of people's minds.</p> <p><b>dream catcher</b> A handmade willow hoop, on which is a woven net or web and is decorated with feathers and beads.</p> <p><b>murals</b> A painted picture on a wall.</p> <p><b>overlap</b> If one thing overlaps another, a part of the first thing occupies the same area as a part of the other thing.</p> <p><b>textiles</b> Textiles are types of cloth or fabric, especially ones that have been woven.</p> <p><b>Tropical</b> Belonging to or typical of the tropics.</p> <p><b>weave</b> If you weave cloth or a carpet, you make it by crossing threads over and under each other.</p> |
